Keeping our residents well-cared for and safe is the reason Willow Brook exists. But just as important is your safety.

With the COVID-19 pandemic crisis upon us, our employees must refrain from non-essential travel via mass transit (airplanes, buses, trains, and cruise lines). The virus is spreading quickly. While you and I may be able to prevail, our aged residents may not fare as well. *Older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions like heart disease, diabetes, and lung disease are at higher risk of becoming <u>seriously ill or dying from this illness</u>. This most vulnerable population are those who have been entrusted to our care.* 

The Center for Disease Control has warned against travel and group social interaction, as they are known to greatly increase the spread of COVID-19. For your sake and the residents' sake, stop your mass transit travel plans until further notice.

We are implementing a temporary emergency policy for staff to refrain from all non-essential mass transit travel (airplane, bus, train, or cruise line). If an employee disregards this directive and still chooses to travel, a non-paid, 14-day self-quarantine will be followed for that employee before he or she can return to work. We *must* protect our at-risk residents! This temporary policy will remain in place until Willow Brook determines that the threat of COVID-19 to our residents no longer exists.

No matter if you're at home or work, please continue to follow all the safety precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Wash your hands often, cough into your elbow, don't touch your face, stay 3 ft. to 6 ft. apart, and don't come to work if you're feeling sick. We all must work together to protect our staff and our residents.
